

## In The Know About Snow!

Winter is here, and in Colorado, that means snow. When temperatures rise above freezing, the snow melts and flows onto the sidewalk, only to later freeze when temperatures drop below freezing. These temperature fluctuations can result in icy and dangerous sidewalk conditions. **Town Code** 

requires all property owners and/or tenants to remove snow and ice from sidewalks within 48 hours of each snow event. If you live on a corner, snow removal is required on both sidewalks - in front of and on the side of your property.

The best way to keep your sidewalk clear is to shovel snow the old-fashioned way. Shoveling frequently will help prevent snow from compacting into ice. When clearing snow from your sidewalk and drive way, pile the snow onto turf areas for winter watering. Got Ice?
